About the Project

This project is part of a larger project to carry Class A Reclaimed Water from the LOTT Budd Inlet Reclaimed Water Plant to portions of Tumwater and Olympia. It involves replacing a four-inch reclaimed water pipeline with a twelve-inch pipeline. Construction will impact the walking trail and footbridge between Heritage and Marathon Parks. Periodic closures of the parking area, bridge, and walking path can be expected during construction. Donovan Excavating, Inc. of Sumner, Washington, is the contractor for the project.

Every effort is being made to reopen the pedestrian bridge by mid-March. Project construction is scheduled for completion in April 2010.

Construction Impacts

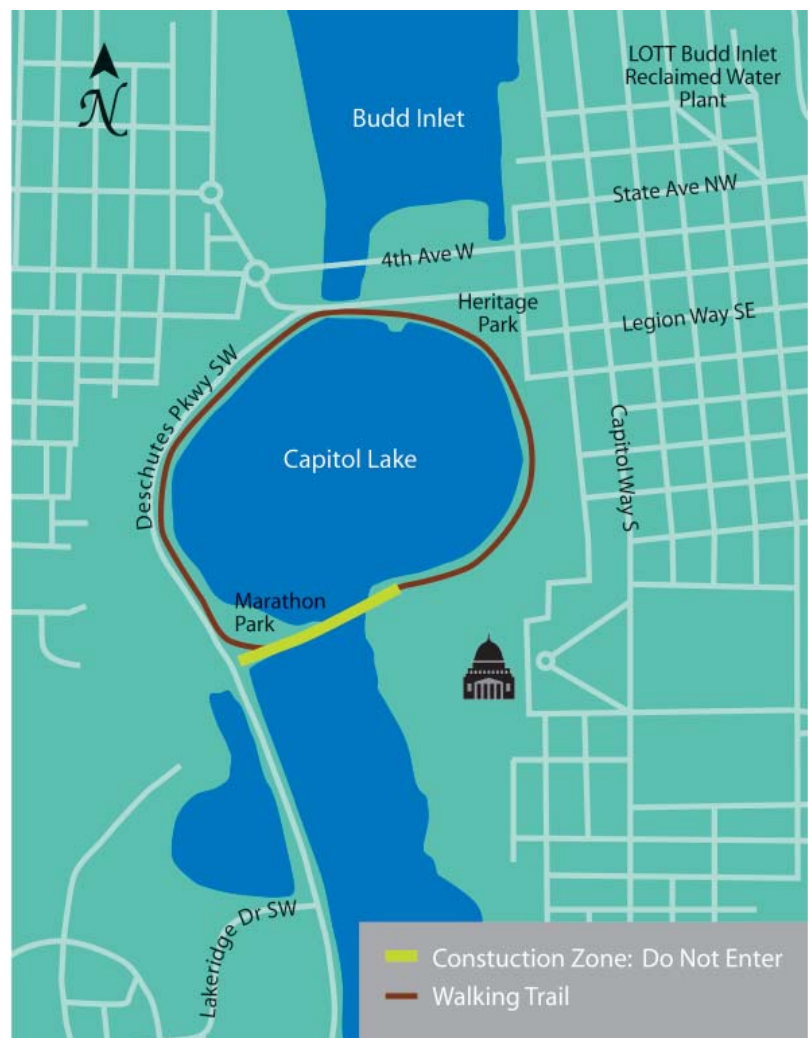
The construction work is taking place along the walking trail and footbridge between Heritage Park and Marathon Park, and within the parking lot at Marathon Park. Replacement of the pipeline on the footbridge requires removal and reinstallation of the bridge decking. The construction area is fenced and off-limits during construction. Every effort is being made to minimize the duration of the closure. However, for public safety, the public must not enter the fenced-off areas, including the footbridge.

Project Funding

This project is funded by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act in cooperation with the United States Environmental Protection Agency and the Washington State Department of Ecology.
